



DECLARATION OF EXCLUSIVITY

SANI SYSTEM POLTI CHECK (product code PTEU0207) is an exclusive over-heated dry steam sanitising device for surfaces that uses the HPMed sanitising liquid.

In fact, effective sanitisation requires high-temperature steam with a low humidity content that does not leave behind residue condensation, a breeding ground for pathogenic microorganisms

SANI SYSTEM POLTI is the only sanitisation device for surfaces that can emit over-heated, dry steam at a temperature of 180°, because:

- It is a product with an Italian patent (Steam Delivery Device; Italian Patent no. MI2006A000506);
- It is a product with an international patent (Steam Delivery Device; International Patent no. PCT/IT2006/000174; International Patent no. WO/2007/108021).

SANI SYSTEM POLTI combines the release of over-heated, dry steam with HPMed, a sanitising solution which was subjected to skin tests and which can also be released in presence of people.

These characteristics make SANI SYSTEM POLTI an exclusive and safe sanitising method. Furthermore, SANI SYSTEM POLTI allows for effective sanitisation of surfaces because it can emit over-heated, dry steam at a distance. Consequently, this avoids any possible risk of immediate recontamination due to direct contact with the device and the treated surface.

SANI SYSTEM POLTI is a medical device that allows for safe sanitisation and re-use of other medical devices and aids and complies with all the essential requirements defined under Annex II of the 93/42/EEC Directive –‘Total Quality Guarantee System’ – and has





been issued a declaration of conformity (Certificate no. 1057/MDD) of the system quality by IMQ, the authorised body of the 93/42/EEC Directive.
